Please be advised that the Board of Psychologist Examiner's jurisdiction is limited. They can only investigate complaints against psychologists licensed by the Board and cannot obtain refunds of money paid to licensees nor necessarily obtain the outcome you desire. The Board can only impose disciplinary measures against a licensee found to have violated the Professional Psychologist Act or Rules adopted by the Board.
